Greek External Borrowing in Historical Perspective

The talk will focus on the foreign loans of Greece during the last 200 years and if and how these promoted the country's economic growth. Reference will also be made to the 2010 crisis in Greece and developments thereafter

Dr. Michalis Psalidopoulos is Professor of Economics Emeritus, University of Athens and, since June 2015, serves as Alternate Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Prior to joining the IMF, he held the Constantine Karamanlis Chair in Hellenic and European Studies at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University, for the academic years 2010/14, while in 2015, he served as Chairman of the Center of Planning and Economic Research in Athens.



Dr. Psalidopoulos graduated from the University of Athens with a degree in Economics, with postgraduate studies in politics, sociology, and economics at the Free University of Berlin, Germany. He was Fulbright Fellow at Duke University in 1993; Stanley J. Seeger Fellow at Princeton University in 1996, and Visiting Research Professor at King's College, London, in 1998. His research focuses on national traditions in the History of Economics and the relationship between economic thought and policy, as well as good governance.
